



#### Stoney Creek Safety Committee Aim

Work with school district, council, school, RCMP and community organizations to ensure the school is equipped and prepared for critical incidents.

In case of emergency - administration, teachers and staff will be under a lot of stress. They will be decision depleted. As parents we want our teachers, staff and first responders to feel as supported as possible during this event. Being well prepared and organized will give them that support. Remember they have families and friends too – they will feel torn – they will want to leave to take care of them but want to stay to make sure their students are safe.

#### Planting seeds...

In 1981, Kansas City two overhead walkways collapsed. 114 perished. 216 were injured. One of the first responders who arrived on the scene was overwhelmed. He wanted to help everyone, but he simply couldn't. He did know he would need all hands-on deck from first responders - but the community as well.

The Shymanskis had taught their five-year-old daughter, Lexi, what to do in case of emergency, knowing it could save her life. Little did they know that a year later, it would save her mother and baby brother too...

"July 2015...The next full-margin rupture of the Cascadia subduction zone will spell the worst natural disaster in the history of the continent, outside of the 2010 Haiti earthquake...In fact, the science is robust, and one of the chief scientists behind it is Chris Goldfinger. Thanks to work done by him and his colleagues, we now know that the odds of the big Cascadia earthquake happening in the next fifty years are roughly one in three. The odds of the very big one are roughly one in ten. Even those numbers do not fully reflect the danger—or, more to the point, how unprepared the Pacific Northwest is to face it. The truly worrisome figures in this story are these: Thirty years ago, no one knew that the Cascadia subduction zone had ever produced a major earthquake. Forty-five years ago, no one even knew it existed..."
